Housing Committee Report

Since last year, the Housing Committee has had several meetings to review possible alternatives for the future housing for Beta Alpha. The committee explored four different alternatives and the following is the results of the research and studies of these alternatives:

- 1. Renovating of the existing structure and adding second and third floors over the party room. The professional services of brother Chuck Dietz, Registered Architect, was retained to prepare some preliminary sketches to determine the maximum number of bedrooms and brothers the expanded house could support. This plan could support a total of 34 beds in 19 rooms. A financial analysis determined that minimum of 38-40 beds was required to cover the cost. After a length discussion it was determined that this opinion was too expense with too many unknown costs on the renovation portion of this plan. The rooms were too small and would not be able to compete with the school dormitory rooms in both cost and quality of living.
- 2. Construction of a new structure on the existing property This plan requires obtaining permission from the City to demolish the existing structure and construct a new Chapter House, since the property has been placed in the James Street Commons Historic District. Before starting a site plan, we received a letter from the City of Newark Board of Education requesting permission to enter onto our property for the purpose of surveying for the possible future home for a new elementary school. The City is still in the planning stages, so this might affect the future of the BA Chapter House. Therefore, all plans on this proposal were halted until we have more information on the City plan.
- 3. The purchase of other properties that will fit our needs. At this time we under preliminary negotiation on a building that might fit our requirements, however we have no further details to report at this time. We will need a due

Guardain Angel – Blackball BA 551b

Beta Alpha lost its guardian, Blackball (551b) in the summer of 2002, to a ruptured tumor in his stomach. The 16-year-old Labrador Husky mix saved two brothers lives during the summer of 1995 when they were held up at gunpoint on the front porch of the chapter house. Sensing something wasn't right Blackball charged down the stairs frightening the mugger, who fired two shots and hit Blackball in the head. The bullet entered between the eyes and exited through his jaw. Blackball soon recovered and continued to live sleeping all day, and begging for food.

Blackball was brought into Beta Alpha in 1987 by Mike Tisdale (551a). He was a transfer brother from the Epsilon Theta Chapter at Seton Hall University. Blackball was brought in to guard the chapter house and he did just that. Most of all Blackball was a loving and loyal dog, to those who came and went or lived at 249 Martin Luther King Blvd. He will forever be remembered and is recognized for his bravery as the only guardian in the Chapter Eternal. *

Journey of Hope, Beta Alpha Style

The Journey of Hope is a Pi Kappa Phi event where 65 brothers from across the nation ride their bicycles from San Francisco to Washington DC, spreading awareness and understanding for people with disabilities.



During this rigorous 4100 mile journey the team spreads their message to 140 million people through the media and other events. Each summer this group of brothers known as Pi Alphas raises over \$250,000 for our national PUSH organization. To better the lives of people with disabilities the money is used to build accessibility ramps, to build playgrounds for children in wheelchairs, and to support GAP weekends.

In the summer of 2001, the Beta Alpha chapter supported its first brother to under take the Journey of Hope challenge. Benjamin Lerch BA 701, was accepted into the program in mid February of that year, and thanks to the strong financial and material contributions from our generous Beta Alpha alumni, Benjamin received over \$5000 and a top of the line bicycle by May of that year. Those four months showed the undergrads what a powerful and willing Alumni Beta Alpha has.

Benjamin would like to thank every brother who donated money and especially would like to thank the Board of Oversees for supporting him in this influential life changing experience. As Benjamin prepares to graduate this spring he would like to offer his support to any brother who decides to accept the challenge of the Journey of Hope. �

diligence period to review and inspect the structure to determine if the building will be able to be converted into a fraternity house, meeting both the building codes and the City of Newark Zoning Regulation. A detailed cost analysis will also be preformed to see if we can support this house financially.

4. Upgrading of the existing chapter house to meet the state fire regulations The deadline for the installation of a fire sprinkler system for a fraternity house is July 2004. We have received a waiver from the state to remain open until this date; therefore the installation of a sprinkler system in the existing structure is the last alternative.

It was decided that since it would not be possible to complete or occupy alternatives 2 or 3 by the required deadline, that the installation of a fire sprinkler system into the existing structure would be a short term solution to this problem and the only feasible alternative at this time. We are actively pursuing quotes for this installation. If you know Mechanical Engineers who design fire protection systems, please have them contact me, as we can use help in determining the type of system to install.
